
Overview of LA County Measure W

Formation and Basic Structure

- Measure W passed by LA County voters in 2018
- Establishes a permanent “impermeable surfaces” property tax of 2.5c per sq ft
- Establishes the Safe Clean Water program for oversight and coordinated planning
 - Note: City and County each have a program called Safe Clean Water. They are not the same thing
- Raises \$250-\$330 M per year
- Funding distributed by LAC Supervisors across 9 LA County Watershed Areas
- SCW funding awarded entirely through a competitive grant process
- Each watershed area has a steering committee – WASC
- South Bay WASC is run by West Basin Water District, Surfriders, and Heal the Bay


South Santa Monica Bay WASC Area



SCW Funding and Priorities

THE SAFE, CLEAN WATER REGIONAL PROGRAM RECEIVES 50 PERCENT OF THE REVENUE FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF PROJECTS AND PROGRAMS THAT WILL

- **INCREASE WATER SUPPLY,**
- **IMPROVE WATER QUALITY, AND**
- **PROVIDE COMMUNITY ENHANCEMENTS**



Infrastructure Program

The Infrastructure Program provides funding for regional multi-benefit watershed-based projects. Not less than 85% of the Regional Program funds will be allocated for implementation of stormwater capture projects.



Cities must provide annual budgets via the Municipal Program proportional to the revenues generated within its boundaries. The Municipal Program is designed to maximize the ability of local governments to address local Stormwater and Urban Runoff challenges and opportunities. Projects and Programs are required to include a water quality benefit; multi-benefit projects and nature-based solutions are strongly encouraged. The Funding can be used for eligible activities such as project development, design, construction, effectiveness monitoring, operations and maintenance (including operation and maintenance of projects built to comply with 2012 MS4 permits), as well as for other programs and studies related to protecting and improving water quality in lakes, rivers and ocean. Up to 30% of Municipal Funds may be used for Maintenance of Effort–Safe, Clean Water Program eligible activities
