
Context and History

- San Pedro Urban Greening Implementation Plan created 2013 2017 144 pages
- Funded by CA Resources Agency
- Executed by LA Conservation Corps
- Engaged all 3 San Pedro Neighborhood Councils, the San Pero Chamber of Commerce, representatives from Council District 15, the Port of Los Angeles, local non-profits and community stakeholders
- Conducted 3 community input sessions drawing 100+ participants
- Incorporated a Needs Assessment and Green Street Typologies modeling
- ▶ Identified 32 specific opportunities to improve greenscapes across San Pedro
- ▶ This assessment reports on observed outcomes across all 32 project proposals

SPUGIP Summary

- ▶ 144 pages in Word or PDF covering program overview, engagement process, analytic frameworks to improve urban habitats and resident quality of life
- 7 Appendices
- ▶ 32 greenscape investment opportunities to create or enhance natural habitat within San Pedro


